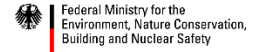

Summary of Workshops pertaining to Education at Sub-National and National Level



CARRIED OUT BY: WWF Paraguay - ParLu

DATES OF EXECUTION: 2013 - 2015

OBJECTIVES:

This document highlights workshops notes and activities which correspond to the following project objectives:

- Conduct six workshops to educate about REDD+ with sub-national (small, medium, and large producers, local communities, and indigenous communities) and national partners.
- Support and encourage the participation of Paraguay's National REDD+ Commission and other relevant partners in the process of workshop implementation.

MAIN RESULTS:

Through the execution of the ParLu project and with the support and active participation of key REDD+ implementation partners and stakeholders, WWF Paraguay has conducted 9 workshops to date, exceeding the project's initial objective. These workshops were carried out in several of the ParLu pilot project locations as well as in the capital of Paraguay, Asunción, various sub-national audiences (including youth, small, medium, and large producers, local communities, decision makers, and indigenous communities) on a variety of REDD+ related topics.

Specific topics covered during workshops have included: promoting a better understanding of REDD+, climate change, REDD+ safeguards, the ParLu project, and community-level work, risks, and benefits of REDD+ activities. Several workshops were conducted with national partners and simultaneously educated participants about payment for ecosystem services and properly managing agricultural chemical inputs (e.g. fertilizers and pesticides).

In total, these workshops have directly reached 248 participants. In addition to the direct knowledge-acquisition benefit, these workshops have reinforced and enforced connections among organizations, thereby strengthening the REDD+ community in Paraguay, generating conversation, information-sharing, and new opportunities.
